The Hebrew word which is translated 'Messiah' means 'anointed one' - the hoped-for King who will save the people of Israel. The Greek word for 'anointed one' is 'christos' - this is the root of the words 'Christ' and 'Christian'. Jesus Christ (Messiah) came to save the world.

Icebreaker question: Can you remember a time when you were given some good news?

Read Isaiah 52:7 together. Think about what it means for you to be a person who brings good news and proclaims peace.

Read Luke 2:8-15 together.

Q. What does this passage tell us about God?

Q. What does this passage tell us about humanity?

How beautiful on the mountains are the feet of those who bring good news, who proclaim peace, who bring good tidings, who proclaim salvation, who say to Zion, "Your God reigns!" -Isaiah 52:7

Q. How will what we have found in this passage make a difference to our lives and the lives of those around us?



Use this time to pray for each other and the world.

You could ask people what they'd like prayer for or they could write their prayers down. Thinking about today's passage, ask God to help you bring good news and peace to the people you meet in your everyday life.

This piece is reminiscent of a shepherd's folk tune, which is suddenly interrupted at 1 minute 50 seconds by the sound of a flugelhorn. Then, the main tune returns jubilantly towards the end. As you listen, imagine the shepherds going about their usual business and being suddenly interrupted by their surprising visitors. As you hear the main tune return, imagine the shepherds returning home from Bethlehem, full of joy and praising God.
