Pray for five

Pray for the churches of your deanery

St Thomas Crookes had a simple basket with parish names on strips of paper. You could this idea as a prayer station to encourage people to pray for churches in your deanery.



Sunday intercessions

When you pray for 'the Church' on Sundays, include prayer for the deanery evangelism events with a visiting bishop. You could make this a monthly feature and then perhaps weekly when the date draws near. This also makes sure the congregation hear about it!

Those of you who like a 'Collect type prayer' could use our Diocesan Vision Prayer as a way to pray for the visit to your deanery.

Prayer walking

Involvement with Arise in Sheffield and other opportunities for prayer walking has alerted us to the value of getting out and praying the areas in which we live.
